PROJECT PURPOSE



The purpose of this consultation is to engage the community and stakeholders in helping define the vision for a new school in Albion housing a neighbourhood learning centre, as well as the vision for a new potential community centre on the same site. The project will also identify conditions for effective collaboration with future service delivery partners in the potential new school and community centre.



BOARD OF EDUCATION PROJECT TIMELINE

Workshop: Albion Elementary [February 10, 2016]

This workshop gave participants an opportunity to explore ideas for the potential elementary school hosting a neighbourhood learning centre, and the potential community centre in the Albion area of Maple Ridge.

Online Survey [February 11 - 15, 2016]

Going live the day after the public consultation workshop, the online survey gave those who were unable to attend the February 10th workshop an opportunity to participate in our public engagement process.

Open House Presentation: Samuel Robertson Technical [February 25, 2016]

At this Open House, the Board of Education and the City of Maple Ridge present the preferred plans for public review and public feedback.

Board of Education Approval [March 9, 2016]

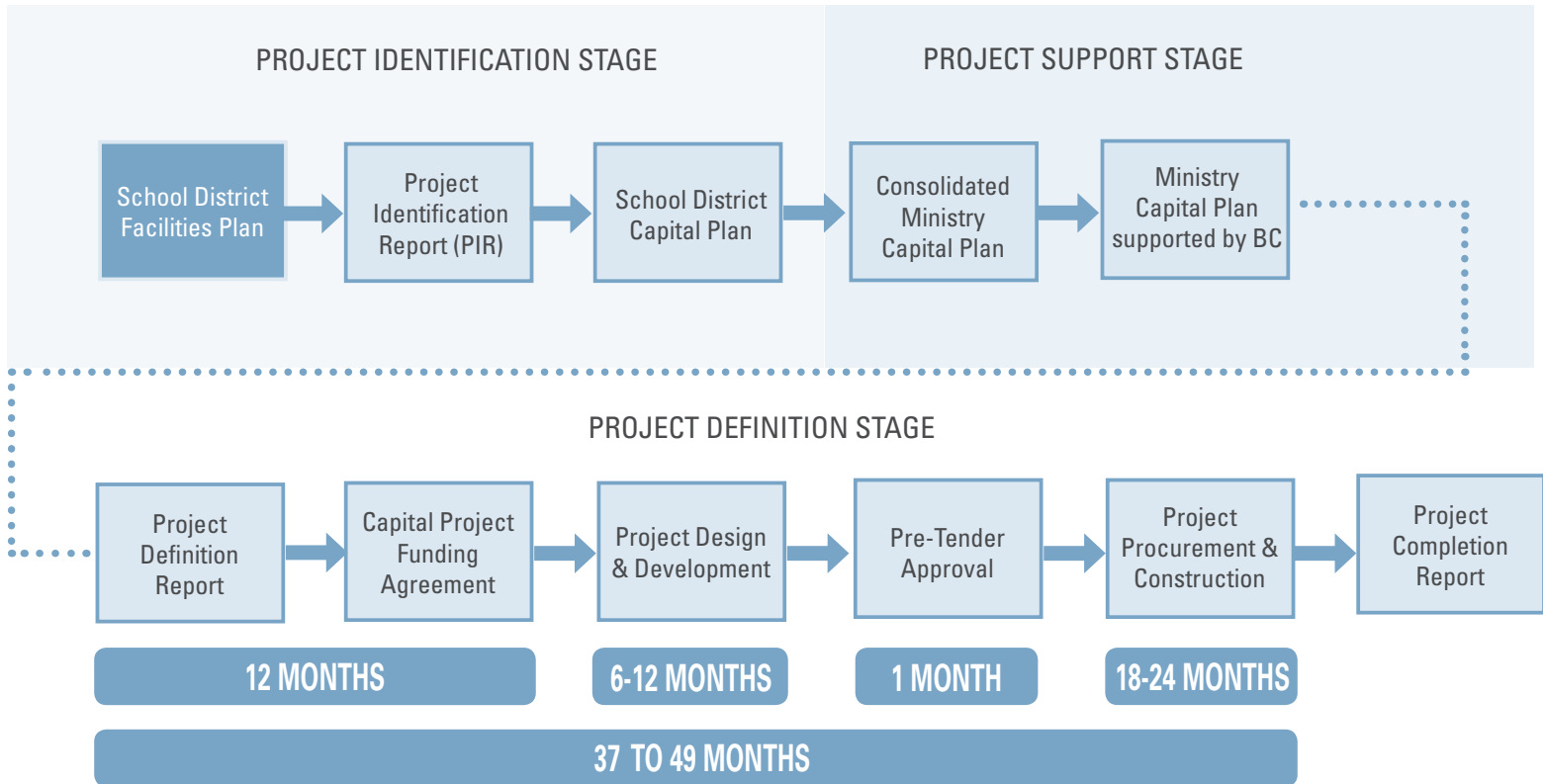
The preferred plan for the elementary school housing a neighbourhood learning centre will be presented to the Board of Education for approval.

Submission to the Ministry of Education [March 31, 2016]

The Board-approved preferred plan for the elementary school housing a neighbourhood learning centre will be submitted to the Ministry of Education for funding approval.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION CAPITAL PLANNING FRAMEWORK



The Ministry of Education provides capital funding for new schools. The estimated ongoing operating facility based costs of \$410,000 for an elementary school must be funded within the existing operating budget.

The timing for building new schools is highly dependent on student population yields and pace of development in Albion. It is projected that in the next decade a new school will be required in the Albion area (104th site) and that one additional school site in this area will also need to be acquired.
